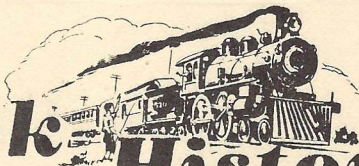

She has researched Rancho Guajome and Rancho Peñasquitos for the rehabilitation of the original adobes, plus the interpretive programs for these projects.
