



This display is a tribute to the late Gino Somocal who hand-crafted (during the span of 33 years) the miniature replicas of the historic Fallbrook buildings shown. COMING EVENTS


We will be participating in the up-coming Art of the Flower Festival, April 3 in the center of town from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.
