When I was a boy I enjoyed listening to the men who worked for my father talk about being in the Army during WWI. I didn't realize it at the time but I was really getting my first firsthand account of world history. I think that it was great for our first group of Fallbrook citizens to get the ball rolling on preserving the history of our town through

artifacts, literature, tools, farm implements and documents. The more donations of local history our museum receives the more interest there will be for everyone. Our new interpretive center and expanded room downstairs next to the Ford Room will be a large improvement. Hundreds of school children have passed through our facilities over the years. Lots of information can be found for school projects with information going back to those early settlers who lived here a long, long time ago.

This is my first letter to you as president although I have been on the Board of Directors about as long as anybody. I follow at least three presidents during my tenure – Marjorie Yackey, Don Rivers and Lee Shaeffer. All very capable and hardworking people. I will do my best to continue in the traditions they began.
