## HAPPENINGS AT THE SOCIETY

New Board member Greg Dehm is creating a Junior Docent volunteer program whose mission will be to encourage in Fallbrook's young people an interest in local history. Junior Docents would be of high school age and should be willing to commit a minimum of four hours of volunteer service per month at the museum. They will work with our Senior Docents, developing hospitality skills and assisting in such things as museum tours and exhibit design Each Junior Docent and maintenance. completing his or her service commitment will receive a certificate from the Fallbrook Historical Society and will be eligible for the "Junior Historian" commendation awarded at the end of the school year. Greg is excited about his new program and has many plans for its expansion!

Greg's wife, Marisa, will be working alongside him by planning special events at the museum that profile our community. Her first event, scheduled for May, is "Come Into Our Kitchen," a look at Fallbrook's culinary efforts in times past. Marisa is also developing a marketing plan to bring more recognition and increased membership to the Historical Society and its museums.

The electric gate on Hill Street will be the Visitors Entrance to the museums. The chainlink gate on Rocky Crest Road is now the construction entrance and will be used by workmen building our new barn.

## Images of America: Fallbrook

It has been my honor and privilege to work with **Rebecca Farnbach** for several months to help create a picture-story of some of the history of Fallbrook and the region we all know and love.

The pictures came from the archives of the Fallbrook Historical Society, from Steven and Rosalie Garnsey in DeLuz, and the Ludy family in Rainbow. Many of the 213 images in this book are photographs of Fallbrook in the early 1900s. Some of them were taken by my grandfather, D.O. Lamb, and by my mother, Annie Lamb Hindorff and her sister, Edna Lamb Graffin. Some of the images were scanned from glass negatives and some from large heavy negatives, postcard size. All of the pictures are in sharp detail in black and white, and are printed on very fine white paper to show every detail.
