Please plan to attend. We look forward to seeing you there!!


#### Thank you Fallbrook Rotary!

#### **Presidents Message**



On April 12th a group of car enthusiasts and avid history buffs celebrated the official recognition of the **Historic Route 395** highway designation through Fallbrook. The ceremony began in River Village in

Bonsall and was presided over by Tom Casey of the Fallbrook Chamber of Commerce. Our own Dode Martin participated in the ribbon cutting along with Christi Knight of Supervisor Bill Horn's office and Assemblyman Kevin Jeffries.

Following the ceremony a vintage fire truck followed by vintage cars of all types led the way into the **Village Square** in Fallbrook to continue the celebration. As I tagged along I let my mind wander back in time and tried to remember some of the landmarks that have disappeared.

The old road pretty much followed the east side of Ostrich Creek to a point and then crossed over to the west side and went straight into town. From Bonsall you were soon in a stretch called Heller's Bend which can still be driven on. You will see it on your left as you climb the grade. In a couple of minutes you will go pass Green Canyon Road and Mrs. Hughes' Silver Springs Café on the right, and then an area known as Skunk Hollow on the left.

Next, as you drive across Ostrich Creek Bridge, will be Story's Dairy on the right. I played under that bridge many times with other kids, knocking down swallows nests with a slingshot, rolling cigarettes out of dried cattails, and harassing the snapping turtles in a nearby pond. Then you come to Old Man Kilgore's Fruit Stand on the left and Tom and Maie Ellis' ranch on the right. Anthony's Avocado Grove (and the famous Anthony corner) was next on the right followed by O'Hearn Realty and Cooper's Cabins. (I can remember riding home with Esles Smith from summer band rehearsal and he would turn his motor off and coast all the way to my house at the dairy.)

From that point the Village began to appear with auto repair shops, filling stations and other business interests. **Dode Martin** and a lot of his friends were very busy evenings and weekends experimenting with how to build a faster car for the drag races that were becoming a fad all over the country. Their shop was right next to **Jup Mahres** service station near Beach Street.

Well, my message is this: Take time to remember the past but don't try to live in it. The best times are right now.

Travel Editor Joe Hilbers recently visited Fallbrook as part of a tour led by Linda Kissam, Fallbrook Area Visitors Bureau, and stopped at the Historical Museum. The following is an excerpt from his article "Fallbrook-Here Art replaces big city hustle and bustle", reprinted with Mr. Hilbers permission

"On this quest we started with a visit to the Fallbrook Historical Society Museum. And once there were fortunate enough to meet with Bruce Dennett, who is one of the dedicated group of volunteers that have made it all a reality. Starting just a decade

ago, the Museum now includes a main building recording Fallbrook's early beginnings. Adjacent is the 1900 farmhouse owned by Rev. William Pittenger, a Methodist Minister and one of the first Civil War soldiers to receive the Medal of Honor. And the newest addition, called the Barn. which when completed will house a collection of early farm machines as well as beautifully restored cars like the Ford Model T and Model A Coupe we admired at some length.

The **Main Museum** offers exhibits like a working miniature model railroad since

as an early ranching and farming community Fallbrook did have the California service Railroad to community and provide transportation for agriculture products. Some 300 Museum members, all volunteers, have made all of this possible. Located at 260 Rocky Crest in Fallbrook, the Fallbrook Historical Society Museum is open Sunday and Thursday from 1 to 4 p.m. with free admission."




