

Can you imagine the cost of running this machine for such a long time! Was he a wealthy person? He drove a nice brown


1940 Chevrolet sedan which, at that time, was nearly new. Did he have a family? He was always alone when you would see him around town.


Volunteer/Docent Christmas Tea and New Exhibit Dedication

NEW ADDITION TO OUR MUSEUM


GRAND OPENING AND RIBBON CUTTING ON SATURDAY, DECEMBER 12, 2009 2 TO 4 P.M.

While it represents many different specimens from many states and countries world-wide, it is also representative of the rocks and minerals in the Fallbrook/DeLuz area and all of San Diego County.


This new display, assembled by family members

a visit - you won't be disappointed!




Geodes

Eric and daughter Allie performing at a recent music festival








